Republica	English Daily	2	Statute Possible in 7 Months	Chairman of the Constituent Assembly (CA) Subas Nembang on Friday said the new constitution can be promulgated within the next seven months if all the parties worked honestly for it. Stating that promulgation of new constitution had not been possible within the stipulated time in the past due to the delay in the formation of State Restructuring Commission and settling the issue of governance system, Nembang said they have developed a CA calendar of operation of seven to nine months to complete the task of constitution writing. Addressing the 34th Executive Council meeting of Nepal Bar Association in Dolakha, Nembang said the delay in implementation of the three-point deal has created suspicions and confusion among the people. Nembang said he is constantly holding talks with the top leaders of the parties to end the current political deadlock.

Republica	English Daily	1	Maoist Politburo to Thrash Out Leadership Issue	Pressure will mount on Maoist Chairman Pushpa Kamal Dahal at the party's upcoming politburo meeting to either change the party's general line or be open about another party leader becoming prime minister if the other political parties want that for forming a national consensus government. The current general line of the Maoist party is to formulate a progressive constitution through the front of parliament, the government and the streets. "The current party line is leading us nowhere. A national consensus government has become a distant dream as the party chairman doesn't want others - acceptable to other political parties -- to become prime minister. So the party should

3.	Gorkhapatra	Vernacular Daily	1	If the Maoists Desire to Lead the New Government, it will be Their Mere Illusion	CPN-UML senior leader K. P. Oli Friday said the UCPN-Maoist could not lead a new consensus government until they embraced democratic norms and values. Addressing zonal party’s training programme in Siraha, Oli said, "If the Maoists desire to lead the new government, it will be their mere illusion. I suggest them stop nurturing such an illusion." Informing about the May 28 three-point deal, he said that the issue of PM’s resignation was included in the deal after Maoist chairman Pushpa Kamal Dahal Prachanda agreed to bring forth their roadmap on the army integration, return of the seized property, disbanding the YCL’s paramilitary structure and the contentious issues relating to the peace process within four days. He accused the Maoists of creating confusion about the deal by focusing only on the PM’s resignation. "The Maoists do not want the promulgation of the new statute as they never put a proposal at the Constituent Assembly meeting that the constitution could be written in time. They just obstructed the meeting of the parliament demanding the PM’s resignation," he said.
